SNOW REMOVAL

Businesses on the walking mall are required to clear the area in front of the property up to the fire lane. Downtown Manager's Update

Branding Campaign

In 2013, Winchester City Council identified the need for an Old Town Branding Campaign as a high priority toward achieving the goal of the Revitalization of Historic Old Town. Creating a new brand for Old Town is about understanding who we are and where we are going as a downtown and what our market niche is. It is about highlighting our assets and using a consistent message and imagery to explain what differentiates us from other nearby downtowns. The firm of Arnett Muldrow has been hired to develop a brand for Winchester.

2013 in Review

A summary of Old Town Winchester activities in 2013 which was recently presented to Council including; new events, updated way-finding signage, opening the new Welcome Center, development of downtown design guidelines and much more.

New Officer Patrolling Downtown

Downtown Winchester has a new downtown officer, Officer Trey Rounds. Officer Frank Jenkins has moved to car patrol duty. Officer Rounds is a member of the Community Response Team and brings the CRT resources into the downtown. Officer Rounds has been patrolling in "plain clothes" for much of his time downtown so far. This has enabled him to observe the activity downtown and monitor the downtown from a new perspective as he is not yet recognizable to those who might follow the rules only if they see a uniformed officer. Another change is that Officer Rounds is patrolling regular hours except Thursdays when he patrols from Noon – 10 p.m. and Fridays from 5 p.m. – 3 a.m.
